

## HEDIS® 2019 is Coming:

### Is Your Team Ready for Medical Record Retrieval, Review and Abstraction?

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What measures will you abstract in 2019? Is your abstraction staff in place? Have you secured your auditor? Is this your first NCQA HEDIS Season? Is your NCQA-certified HEDIS software vendor in place?

### Step 1: HEDIS Medical Record Retrieval, Review and Abstraction

Timeline: Now through November

#### Determine your staffing requirements and your budget to meet those requirements

- Did you secure and review enough records to meet your goal rates in 2018?

#### Determine whether your internal team can perform the work, if you need to hire an external vendor, or both

- How many people will you need on your team?
- Do you need to ramp up resources with existing permanent positions, or will you hire temporary resources?

#### Retrieval and Abstraction Teams

- Determine whether you need to have separate retrieval and abstraction teams.
- Update position descriptions, capture the skills and requirements necessary to ensure HEDIS success.
- To save on internal resources, consider outsourcing retrieval and/or abstraction by hiring qualified, experienced seasonal staff.

#### Hire!

- Align with the most capable, experienced HEDIS reviewers and abstractors.
- Secure commitments from qualified candidates.

### Step 2: Training

Timeline: October – January 2019

- Did you archive Q&A from the 2018 HEDIS season?
- Review those archived FAQs to identify any topic or measure that solicited questions or confusion during the last season. Ensure that they are covered in depth, within your training materials.

#### Do you have Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) for each of the measures or functional areas?

- Engage your SMEs in the creation and revision of your presentations.
- Highlight your SMEs' best practices within your slide decks.

#### Was your Inter-Rater Reliability (IRR) Testing effective last season?

- Did your auditor raise questions regarding validity?
- Did you find that some abstractors “slipped through the cracks” and made annotation and/or data entry errors, either because they were not properly trained or did not have the background to accurately find data points?
- If applicable, take the time to address the above concerns in this season's training.

**Ensure that there is a comprehensive understanding of NCQA's 2019 Technical Specifications across all functional areas.**

- Engage your auditor in this process as necessary.

**Create the training schedule**

- Early to mid-January is optimal to begin training, so that it's fresh in everyone's minds AND to minimize training staff, who may take other positions prior to the start of the HEDIS season.
- Schedule training. Now that you have determined your timeframe for training, you can hire candidates with a firm start date.

**Teamwork is essential to HEDIS success! Cross-functional training ensures that all teams have insight into what their HEDIS cohorts are doing.**

- Include all teams involved with HEDIS in your training:
  - The reporting team can learn why they are programming reports a certain way.
  - The medical record abstraction team can learn how the data input affects reporting.
  - The software technicians can learn where data comes from.
  - The retrieval team can learn what happens to the records they bring in.

## Step 3: Reporting

Timeline 2019: February – May

**Were you able to accurately track and trend abstractor IRR and overread scores last season?**

- Did you have multi-level reporting to meet your reporting needs and help you successfully manage your project?
- Did your Executive Dashboard reports provide the high-level view that is necessary for oversight of HEDIS Quality operations?
- Did your reports contain the data elements and information to provide a high-level view of the project for the executive team as well as support ongoing operations?

**Has your report assessment found that last season's reports need a tune-up?**

- Review last year's "nice to have" reports:
  - Can you justify those reports, now that you have done an assessment of how they can yield the data necessary for the ongoing success of your project?
  - Will those new reports lessen the manual work and make your job easier?
- Now is the time to adjust your reports. Get your requests in early: Data teams usually have a full task list, so make sure you are at the head of the line for custom reports.
